The amount (\$) of the scholarship depends on the number of applicants/recipients.

-Student must be an active member of FHF Club, provide proof of college enrollment/pursuing a career working with people with special needs, and complete at least one of the following: successfully complete pathway choices/classes in the areas of early childhood education and teacher education or health occupations, work as an Adapted PE or special education class student intern through the Work Based Learning Program, **and/or** volunteer and log a substantial number of hours assisting with FHF Club trips/events as an active member of the FHF Club Officers Committee.

-Complete attached application.

-Student - as they have opportunities / as they pursue a college degree - must commit to stay involved in supporting/encouraging children who have special needs through FHF Club or similar organizations.

-Required: Supply a list of extra-curricular school and club activities, community activities, and employment history during your middle and high school years. Include years of involvement, honors/awards, and positions of leadership.

-Optional: Ask (3) teachers to write a recommendation as to why they believe you deserve the scholarship. Ask them at least two weeks in advance to give them plenty of time to complete your request.

Note: Even if you have been awarded a full college scholarship, you are still eligible to receive a Susan A. Smith FHF Club Memorial Scholarship Recipient plaque and recognition! If you have been awarded a partial college scholarship, you are eligible to receive a Susan A. Smith FHF Club Memorial Scholarship and plaque. Scholarship checks for tuition only provided by Friends Helping Friends Club, Inc. are made out to and mailed directly to the college. FHF Scholarship Recipients must follow the directions on the FHF Club Scholarship Recipient Instructions letter. This letter will be presented to FHF Club Scholarship Recipients during the ECCHS Senior Scholarship Night Ceremony.

- Why did you choose to work with students who have special needs?
- Explain why you deserve this scholarship?
- What do you plan to do to help people with special needs in the future?
- After college, how do you plan to influence others in your community to get involved to help others who have special needs?
